1.	PAI101	Arabic (2 credits)	<p>This is a compulsory course which has no prerequisite. It supports the achievement of the Expected Learning Outcomes in the form of graduates' ability to apply Indonesian, Arabic, and English in academic and social activities (ELO4).</p> <p>Upon the completion of the course, students are expected to be able to master basic knowledge and skills in Arabic language in terms of grammar (<i>nahwu-shorof</i>), listening skill (<i>maharoh istima</i>), and speaking skill (<i>maharoh kalam</i>).</p> <p>The course is delivered using student-centered learning, active learning, contextual learning, and blended learning approaches.</p>
2.	PAI102	Philosophy (2 credits)	<p>This is a compulsory course which has no prerequisite. It supports the achievement of the Expected Learning Outcomes in the form of graduates' ability to apply the sciences of religion, philosophy, psychology, sociology, and culture as a perspective in the development of Islamic education learning (ELO12).</p> <p>Upon the completion of the course, students are expected to be able to explain the basic concepts of philosophy, philosophical thoughts according to philosophers and philosophical schools, and ontological, epistemological, and axiological concepts.</p> <p>The course is delivered using student-centered learning, active learning, contextual learning, and blended learning approaches.</p>
3.	PAI103	Ulumul Qur'an (2 credits)	<p>This is a compulsory course which has no prerequisite. It supports the achievement of the Expected Learning Outcomes in the form of graduates' ability to read and write the Qur'an following the correct rules (ELO3) and to carry out the learning process of Islamic education and/or in the scientific field of Qur'an-hadith, (Islam theology and ethics (<i>aqidah-akhlak</i>), Islamic law (<i>fiqh</i>), and history of Islamic culture based on information technology (ELO5).</p> <p>Upon the completion of the course, students are expected to be able to apply the science of <i>asbabun nuzul</i> correctly, to apply the knowledge of Al-Qur'an interpretation to understand the</p>

			<p>contents of the Qur'anic verses, and to study the historical wisdom of the revelation of the Al-Qur'an.</p> <p>The course is delivered using student-centered learning, active learning, contextual learning, and blended learning approaches.</p>
4.	PAI104	Ushul Fiqh (3 credits)	<p>This is a compulsory course which has no prerequisite. It supports the achievement of the Expected Learning Outcomes in the form of graduates' ability to carry out the learning process of Islamic education and/or in the scientific fields of Qur'an-hadith, Islamic theology and ethics (<i>aqidah-akhlak</i>), Islamic law (<i>fiqh</i>), and history of Islamic culture based on information technology (ELO5).</p> <p>Upon the completion of the course, students are expected to be able to explain the position of <i>ushul fiqh</i> concerning the legal system in Indonesia, the sources and basic principles of Islamic law, and master the basic methodology of Islamic law.</p> <p>The course is delivered using student-centered learning, active learning, contextual learning, and blended learning approaches.</p>
5.	PAI105	Ulumul Hadis (2 credits)	<p>This is a compulsory course which has no prerequisite. It supports the achievement of the Expected Learning Outcomes in the form of graduates' ability to carry out the learning process of Islamic education and/or in the scientific fields of Qur'an-hadith, Islamic theology and ethics (<i>aqidah-akhlak</i>), Islamic law (<i>fiqh</i>), and history of Islamic culture based on information technology (ELO5).</p> <p>Upon the completion of the course, students are expected to be able to explain the function of hadith as a source of Islamic law and a way of life, apply the science of hadith interpretation to understand the contents of the Qur'an, analyse their historical context (<i>asbabul wurud</i>) and reflect on wisdoms in the history of the emergence of hadith.</p> <p>The course is delivered using student-centered learning, active learning, contextual learning, and blended learning approaches.</p>
6.	PAI106	Educational Science (3 credits)	<p>This is a compulsory course which has no prerequisite. It supports the achievement of the Expected Learning Outcomes in the form of graduates' ability to apply educational theories in the development of Islamic education (ELO11).</p>

			<p>Upon the completion of the course, students are expected to be able to explain the essence of education, compare the thoughts of educational figures, and reconstruct educational thoughts.</p> <p>The course is delivered using student-centered learning, active learning, contextual learning, and blended learning approaches.</p>
7.	UNI001	Deepening of Islamic basic values (PNDI)	This is a religious development activity to introduce students to the vision of life, monotheism, worship and morals. Students will be given introductions and then students will be guided and fostered by male mentor (<i>musyrif</i>) or female mentor (<i>musyrifah</i>) or facilitators who are competent in terms of worship practices and morality.
8.	UNI002	Qur'anic Self-Development (PDQ)	Thus is a religious development activity that focuses on guidance and assistance in reading and writing the Qur'an and memorizing the Qur'an juz 30 (<i>juz amma</i>) and selected hadiths, as well as learning Arabic vocabulary for understand the Qur'an.
9.	UNI003	Self-Development Training (PPD)	This is a religious development activity to develop students' intrapersonal and interpersonal skills. The focus of the study material is learning techniques and self-motivation, governance and cooperation, as well as creativity and thinking strategies.
10.	UNI004	Leadership and Da'wah Training (PKD)	This is a religious development activity to develop good leadership and da'wah skills for students.
11.	UNI600	Islamic Education (2 credits)	<p>This is a compulsory course which has no prerequisite.
